Could I please take the opportunity to remind all parents/carers that there is no vehicular access onto the school site during 8.30-9.15am & 3.00-3.30pm unless a disability parking permit has been applied for from the school. This is to ensure the safety of our children and school community during very busy periods on the school premises.

We have received several complaints recently that a number of parents/ carers are dropping children off in the mornings. In some cases vehicles are being driven at excess speed onto the site and entrances to the staff car park are being blocked.

The main gate has also been damaged due to it being hit by a parent's vehicle. As I'm sure you can image, this has resulted in considerable cost to the school to have the gate repaired, which the school hadn't budgeted for. Could I please ask all parents to park outside of the school premises when dropping off and picking up children. No access onto the school site will be granted during the time periods outlined above.
